**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VICTORVILLE
SUPPORTING THE DISPLAY OF THE NATIONAL MOTTO, "IN GOD WE
TRUST" IN THE NEW VICTORVILLE CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS**

WHEREAS, "In God We Trust" became our national motto 50 years ago on July 30, 1956, shortly after this nation led the world through the trauma of world War II; and

WHEREAS, the words have been used on U.S. currency since 1864; and

WHEREAS, the same inspiring slogan is engraved above both the entrance to the Senate Chamber and above the Speaker's dais in the House of Representatives; and

WHEREAS, in both war and peace, these words have been a profound source of strength and guidance to many generations of Americans.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Victorville does hereby declare that the national motto "In God We Trust" shall become a prominent part of our City and these historic words shall be permanently displayed as the centerpiece of the new City Council Chambers at Victorville City Hall.

PRESENTATION OF REQUEST TO CANCEL CITY COUNCIL'S SUBSCRIPTION TO THE LOS ANGELES TIMES

PRESENTATION OF REQUEST TO APPROVE THE DEVELOPMENT FEE/CREDIT AGREEMENT FOR FIRE STATION WEST OF HIGHWAY 395

Fire Chief Becker reported that the issue before the Council is a Fee/Credit Agreement to develop a fire station west of Highway 395. In the past the City has had to use DIF fees to develop fire stations, but if the developer donates the land and contributes to the fire station, then they will receive the DIF fee credits. It is a beneficial arrangement for the City.

It was moved by Councilmember Caldwell, seconded Councilmember Almond, to approve the Development Fee/Credit Agreement for the fire station west of Highway 395; motion carried unanimously.
